#### 100 Days of School Party - PM Class

On June 1<sup>st</sup> our PM class will be celebrating 100 days of school. Each MWF that they have come to IVNS we've been counting and they are all very excited to finally be getting close to 100. We've been using a rows & columns 100's chart this year, and the kids have really started to grasp the concept of those higher numbers. Fives and tens are also tagged in red (the others are black), so they've been able to easily identify the pattern visually. This year all we ask is that you help your child to count out 100 small items at home. You don't have to send them into class. It's important for them to be able to count each item for the correct number that it is, so please try to sit with them to help with corrections. Cheerios, pennies, beans, anything! Practicing outside of the classroom will help them to apply the idea anywhere!



#### **Art Show Preparation**

Every day of class between now and May 20<sup>th</sup> is super important. We're spending lots of time crafting and creating for individual and group projects for our upcoming Art Show. If your child is missing class he/she is missing a project for the Art Show. Please be aware of the clothing that your child is wearing to school - send them in their worst clothes. We're putting smocks on and trying to stay clean, but sometimes art us just plain MESSY. We don't want to ruin any clothes that you are trying to keep nice!
