Photos Needed for Star of the Week

What we need families to do:

Please send in 5-8 photos of your child and family members so we can make a poster for your child. Photos printed on regular printer paper are the best because we will laminate the poster - so please don't send in original photos. Each child will have their own poster of their family photos hanging up in the classroom for the school year, and when it is their week to be the Star we move their poster up to the main circle time board, and they spend a bit of circle time telling us who is in their photos and what they are doing. Baby photos are great, and photos of people they can talk about at circle time. After we get all of your child's photos in and posters made we'll make a schedule for each child's week and will share dates with you. We'll send out info and reminders when it's your child's week to be the Star!

Mid-Winter Break Next Week - CLOSED

Just a reminder that we will be closed next week, February 15th-19th. If any families travel farther than 120 miles away from home during the break we do ask that you quarantine at home for 10 days after returning. Please help us all stay healthy by following our travel expectations and current protocol given to us by the Nevada Dept. of Health.

Stinky Snow Clothes

It's time to wash your child's snow clothes (if you aren't already doing so regularly). We've had some pretty stinky and wet snow clothes come out of bags in the past few days. Nobody wants to put on wet mittens or snow clothes - so it is important that you take them out of them bag each day when you get home and hang to dry.

We've also had a number of students come in from the playground with wet socks or pants. You are welcome to send a change of dry socks or pants to school so they can change into dry items afterwards.

Kindergarten Registration

It may sound early, but it's time to start thinking about Kindergarten if you have a 4 or 5 year old who will be attending in the fall! Incline Elementary's registration is officially open and we recommend starting the process now if you are going to send your child to IES. If you're interested in Lake Tahoe School, Kings Beach Elementary, Tahoe Expeditionary Academy, or other charter schools in the area please reach out to those schools now and get the information you need to register on time. Many of these schools have deadlines in February or March and we don't want you to miss out. We will be talking about Kindergarten in your upcoming parent conferences, but please don't hesitate to ask if you have questions or need any help in the registration process.

Board Meeting

We have a few new families at IVNS and we wanted to make sure you know that all parents are welcome to attend our monthly Board meetings. In fact; we are always looking for new Board members! You can attend any meeting just as a parent, or to explore the opportunity of taking an actual seat on the Board. Being a Board member is easy and carries a lot of power - as a non-profit organization all of the decisions for IVNS are made by voting Board members, and as a parent that is a good position to be in. All Board meetings are currently held online through Zoom which makes it even easier to attend.

Covid Reminders

We wanted to remind our families of our Covid rules and regulations. We are seeing a large increase in positive cases in both California and Nevada, and we need to be extra cautious now that we are back in school. If we want IVNS to stay open we need our families to be vigilant about following our Covid rules and regulations. Exposure in our classroom could result in a closure, and we do not want to do that!

Basic reminders:

* If any members of your household are experiencing ANY symptoms on the Covid list then all students MUST stay home until 72 hours after symptoms go away. Even if the student has zero symptoms, but a family member does - the student must stay home.

* If any members of your household test positive for Covid *you must inform us immediately* so we can administer proper contact tracing and communicate with other families. All personal info will be kept private, but it is important that we let our other families know if there as been any exposure to a positive case.

* If any members of your household test positive your entire household must quarantine. Students may not return to school until 10 days have passed since the last symptom in the household.

* Any temperatures over 100.2* will be sent home immediately, or we ask you to keep your child home before coming to school.

*Mask up in public, and be responsible community members. Risking exposure in a group outing or community event not only puts your family at risk, but all the other families and teachers in our program as well. Please be mindful when you are out in public. Let's keep IVNS open!



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
